A dvocates received two very generous grants from the Women's Giving Circle of Frederick County to help house and provide assistance with transportation and childcare expenses for up to 20 single mothers in our program. Both grants provide incentives for these women to overcome barriers to attaining the education and job training needed to ensure a stable future for themselves and their children. Most of the women in our program have monthly incomes of \$1,000 or less and do not have cars. Access to childcare and reliable transportation are foreemost on their minds, as they struggle to work and go to school to better their living circumstances and ensure a secure future. To receive financial assistance and remain in our housing program, however, participants must be going to school full- or part-time and/or working after a short stabilization period.

Advocates was one of 15 organizations serving women and children awarded 23 grants this year. The Women's Giving Circle of Frederick County, founded in 2006, brings women together who share common philanthropic goals to benefit women's needs. This is an amazing organization! We wish to thank all of the members of the Women's Giving Circle for their support for the women and children in our programs. Jackie and her son Ja'Kwon graduate to stable, permanent housing in September 2013. Before acceptance into our housing in July 2011, they were doubled-up with friends and sleeping on couches or the floor. At the time, Jackie was working as a part-time laundress at a local hotel at minimum wage. She now works full-time at an assisted-living facility. While in our program, she has taken major steps to stabilize her finances by eliminating old debt, establishing a savings account, and purchasing and maintaining a car through our partner Second Chance garage. Jackie also attended Frederick Community College for studies in computer science and is continuing a job search in that field. She is now positioned to start anew and move toward a bright future.
